## Dr. Patrick F. Foley Completes Term as President of The American Board of Orthodontics

Patrick F. Foley, D.D.S., M.S.D., of Mundelein, Ill., completed his term as president of The American Board of Orthodontics (ABO) as of April 23, 2023. As immediate past president, he continues as an ABO officer for the 2023-2024 year.

The other 2023-2024 officers of the ABO are **Timothy S. Trulove, D.M.D., M.S.,** of Montgomery, Ala., president; **Jae Hyun Park, D.M.D., M.S.D., M.S., Ph.D.,** of Phoenix, Ariz.,
president-elect; and **Roberto Hernández Orsini, D.M.D., M.P.H., M.S.,** of Juana Díaz, Puerto Rico, secretary-treasurer.

The ABO directors are responsible for establishing policy with regard to the board certification of specialists in orthodontics. Each ABO director represents one of the eight constituent organizations of the AAO and serves an eight-year term, which culminates in the position of the president. During his tenure as an ABO director, Dr. Foley has represented the Midwestern Society of Orthodontists (MSO).



Dr. Foley is associate professor and assistant director of the Center for Advanced Dental Education at Saint Louis University. He previously had a private practice in orthodontics in Lake Zurich, Ill., for 30 years.

First certified by the ABO in 1995, he is a member of the College of Diplomates of the American Board of Orthodontics (CDABO). He is a past president of the Illinois Society of Orthodontists and is member of the World Federation of Orthodontists.

Dr. Foley obtained his dental degree from the University of Illinois and his master's degree in orthodontics from Saint Louis University. His undergraduate degree is from Northern Illinois University.
